OBJECTIVES

Our study of Hawaiian will focus on successfully demonstrating the following competencies upon completion of the first year of study:

Listening Comprehension

- 1. Understand, with some repetition, simple questions involving learned material.
 - 2. Comprehend the main idea upon listening to a simplified passage. Reading Comprehension
 - 1. Read and understand the information presented in a simple paragraph. Speaking
- 1. Pronounce the language well enough to be intelligible to native speakers accustomed to dealing with non-native speakers.
 - 2. Ask and answer questions involving learned material.

Writing

1. Write a short paragraph on a familiar topic.

<u>Cultural Knowledge</u>

1. Handle routine social situations in a culturally appropriate manner.

COURSE POLICIES

Your attendance is required to successfully complete this course. Language acquisition comes with daily practice. It is important that we move forward as a whole 'ohana. We will often practice in pairs or small groups. Unexcused absences will make learning more difficult not only for you but also for your classmates who will be depending on you. It is essential that you **prepare adequately for each class.** If a lesson is not read and familiarized by you before class, the result will be the wasting of other students' time in class.

You are responsible for assignments and tests. If you are absent and miss turning in an assignment or miss a test, no grade/points will be awarded.

BOOKS / SUPPLIES

The text for this course is <u>Nā Kai 'Ewalu</u> by Kamanā and Wilson. A required book for this course that can be obtained at any bookstore is <u>The Pocket Hawaiian</u> <u>Dictionary</u> by Elbert, Mo'okini, and Pukui.

Other supplies you will need include a binder or folder for handouts and worksheets, looseleaf paper, two sixty-minute blank audio cassettes of medium quality, and a 3.5" double-sided, double-density computer disk. (For use on the Macintosh -- not IBM)
