5. GENERAL COURSE OBJECTIVES

To develop a working understanding of study skills and writing style in the area of psychology. Students will learn to write in APA style for both term papers and research papers and learn skills in understanding simple and complex terms in psychological research.

6. SPECIFIC COURSE COMPETENCIES:

Upon completion of this course, the student should be able to:

- a. Analyze how psychologists think when approaching psychological research.
- b. Debate whether psychology is a science. Explain the scientific method.
- c. Operationally define hypotheses and show how psychologists test hypotheses, plan, develop and carry out research.
- d. Compare and contrast scientific and nonscientific investigations.
- e. Examine psychology's image problem and how psychology differs from other social science disciplines.
- f. Examine at least five careers in the field psychology and the education needed to attain those careers
- g. Identify and apply the APA style of writing both in term papers and research papers.
- h. Write a short paper in APA style.
- i. Learn how to learn by recognizing different study skills and applying appropriate skills to psychological literature.
