The Jeanne Clery Act mandates that each institution is required to report statistics concerning the occurrence of certain criminal offenses reported to the local police agency or any official of the institution who has "significant responsibility for student and campus activities." This position is defined as a Campus Security Authority. CSAs must be trained and aware of their responsibilities. Our campus will send out a request for yearly statistics to all CSAs via letter or email each year for the previous calendar year.
