#### Suggestions for Zero Waste:

- · Use cloth napkins.
- Use a sponge or cloth rag instead of paper towels.
- Use rechargeable batteries instead of disposable ones.
- Go online or to the library to read your favorite magazine, book or newspaper rather than purchasing them.
- Use plates, cups and utensils you can wash instead of paper plates, cups and plastic utensils that you have to throw away.
- Purchase items in concentrate, such as juice and detergent, when possible.
- Choose products in recyclable or refillable containers.

## \*Water Refilling Stations

The campus currently has three water refilling stations. Their locations are:

- Ho'okipa Building, hallway, between the Personnel and Educational Opportunity Center (EOC) offices.
- Pilina Building, second floor, hallway, between the Student Life and Academic Affairs Vice Chancellor's office.
- Library Building, second floor, near the elevator.

There are current plans to install more water filling stations this year.

All are encouraged to bring your own glass or reusable water bottles to enjoy this sustainable convenience.



## \*Campus Recycling

Faculty, staff and students can participate in the recycling of cardboard, newspaper, glass containers, plastic bottles and aluminum and steel cans in several ways.

The Kahului Recycling and Redemption

Center is located on the UHMC campus near
the 'Ike Le'a building on Wahine Pio Road by
the entrance of the Keopulani Park.

Their hours are:

Residential Recycling: 7:00 am - 7:00 pm, daily

HI-5 Redemption:

Wednesday through Sunday 8:30 am to 4:30 pm

There are recycling bins for both aluminum cans and plastic bottles throughout the campus. Please be mindful of these containers making sure not to use them for your daily trash.

#### \*Cardboard Guidelines

- Cardboard & Paper Bags
- Corrugated boxes, boxboard
- Cardboard rolls, cartons
- All colors & sizes
- 1. Break down & flatten all sizes
- 2. Remove all plastic or foam liners
- 3. No food residue.

# \*Book Recycling

Book recycling is encouraged, allowing others to have your used books, sharing them with others instead of throwing them away.

## \*Paper & Shredded Recycling

Paper recycling bins are currently located in the Pilina Building, first floor by the center stairs. A more robust paper and shredded paper recycling program is planned for "rollout" this year.
