CONGRATULATIONS TO MOLOKAI'S FIRST GRADUATING IHM COHORT

Students of the Institute of Hawaiian Music (IHM) are in their final semester of the two-year program and will be graduating this Spring with an Academic Subject Certificate (A.C.S.) in Hawaiian Music. As the culminating project for the semester, students have been working diligently on compiling original songs about Molokai on to one CD, with a release date this coming May.

The cohort ranged from established performers to those who simply wanted to play music. Hula dancer Natalie Luczon expressed her "love [for] Mele Hawai'i because it really showcases how beautiful the 'ōlelo Hawai'i can be used descriptively and poetically and it gives us a glimpse into the minds of renowned artists of the past and present. The Institute of Hawaiian Music's (IHM) is a one-of-a-kind musical mentorship program dedicated to the perpetuation and preservation of Hawaiian music. "Starting a career in Hawaiian music can be a challenge," said IHM Faculty Coordinator Dr. Keola Donaghy. "Aspiring musicians are often left to their own devices to locate willing mentors and performance partners, receive personal training, find gigs, gain performance experience, produce a recording, and learn the steps necessary to break into the industry." IHM offers classes in guitar, ukulele, singing, keyboard, composition, music theory, repertoire development, dance, music industry business and marketing, and recording.

Amongst this group of students are father-daughter duo, Chad Lima and Trinnity Lima-Napoleon. Trinnity is an Early College High School student in the Ho'okele Program and the first female high school student to earn this certificate. When asked what she enjoys about the class, she says, "Its pretty cool to now know how to read the carpenter square (to get straight lines and angles)." Her father Chad Lima states, "Nice to have gained an understanding of how to read a carpenters measuring tape."

NON-CREDIT TRAINING IGNITES INNOVATION

This semester required innovative ideas to offer quick, flexible, non-credit training and credentialing for the Molokai campus. We offered conversational Hawaiian language, renewable energy and solar trainings, and digital design certificate. While the 'ōlelo Hawai'i class was offered in-person at the Molokai Education Center, the renewable energy courses and digital design was held completely online via Zoom. Both Zoom certificates offered 100% tuition sponsorship.

The benefits of non-credit training is that it has a different fee structure than regular college courses.
