

STEP 1 APPLY

APPLICATION

HEALTH CLEARANCE

Submit your Health Clearance Form confirming Tuberculosis (TB) and Measles, Mumps, Rubella (MMR) immunization before you register. Download the form at:

maui.hawaii.edu/Health_Clearance.pdf and fax to our campus Health Center at (808) 242-1578. Need a low-cost test or have questions? Call (808) 984-3493.



After you've applied, 3-7 days later you'll receive an acceptance letter with your Student ID number. You'll need your Student ID number to setup your MYUH account, and take the COMPASS placement test. Questions? Call (808) 984-3267.

STEP 2 PREPARE TO ENROLL

COMPASS PLACEMENT TEST

An English reading/writing and math COMPASS placement test is required to register for most classes. You'll need your Student ID number and a picture ID. Testing is available at The Learning Center (TLC) on a walk-in basis, or you can call for help to find a testing center near you. Calculators permitted. Visit maui.hawaii.edu/tlc or call (808) 984-3240.

TRANSCRIPTS

If you've attended college outside the University of Hawai'i system, request official transcripts from your previous campuses and send to Admissions & Records. You'll also need to fill out a Transcript Evaluation Form and submit it to Admissions. The form can be downloaded at:

Once you've received your acceptance letter with your Student ID number, go to myuh.hawaii.edu to setup your MyUH account. The UH portal will serve as your home base from where you will register for classes, check e-mail and financial aid status, access academic services, and find UH news.

FAFSA FOLLOW-UP

UHMC's Financial Aid office will use your UH email address to communicate with you. Check your MyUH account for financial aid updates, including any needed additional documents in your Student Requirements, how to accept your award, or sign up for an e-refund.

ACADEMIC ADVISING AND ED PLAN

Once you've completed your COMPASS placement test, schedule an appointment with a UHMC academic counselor for help with registration, course selection, your major, or any general questions. Also, learn how to use STAR, an online system that helps you track your credits, view courses you've taken in the UH System, and see how your courses fit your academic goal. STEP 3 REGISTER AND PAY

REGISTER

Register for classes online through your MyUH account at the earliest possible date to ensure you get your preferred classes. Registration dates, class schedules and class availability are posted on the UHMC website:


TUITION

TEXTBOOKS
