- 124 students enrolled over the past fall 2011, spring 2012 and summer 2012.
- 40% of Co-op students received job offers upon completion of their internship experience.
- Unfortunately, 4% of registered Co-op students did not meet minimum eligibility requirements of the course to satisfy the 2.0 GPA requirement, thus dropped the course.




