Step 1 – Apply

Submit an Application

All University of Hawai'i campuses use the same System Application Form for undergraduate enrollment. [Click here to start your application online.](#)

Application Deadlines: **Fall Semester** – August 1; **Spring Semester** – December 1

Resident or Non-Resident?

You must submit the Residency Declaration form, which is part of the [online application](#). It is used to determine your residency status for tuition purposes.

If you do not qualify as a bona fide resident of the State of Hawai'i, according to the UH regulations in effect at the time you register, you must pay [nonresident tuition](#) for your classes.

You must also pay a \$25.00 application fee. At the end of the online registration process, if you've indicated you are a non-resident you will be prompted for payment.

Residency status will be determined at the time of application. You may be required to provide verifying documentation.

Acceptance Notification

For general admissions, notification will be sent within two weeks after the UH System Application and other required documents are received.

During periods when a high volume of applications is being processed, notification of acceptance or rejection may be delayed.

Applicants applying prior to deadlines are notified of their status. Applicants applying after the deadlines are asked to check with the Admission and Records office regarding their admission status and registration information.

Student ID

After you've applied, 3-7 days later you'll receive an acceptance letter with your Student ID number. You'll need your Student ID number to set up your MyUH account, and take the COMPASS placement tests.

Health Clearance

The UH System requires that Tuberculosis (TB) and Measles Mumps Rubella (MMR) immunization clearances be submitted to the Admissions and Records office prior to registration.

Need a low-cost test or have questions? Call our [Health Center](#) at (808) 984-3493. *You may be accepted to College without clearance, but you will not be able to register for classes until your health clearance documents are received.*

Financial Aid

Check with the [Financial Aid Office](#) at (808) 984-3277 to see if you're eligible for financial aid and scholarship opportunities. UH Maui College's FAFSA code is 001615.

If you're a resident of Maui County, you may also be eligible for assistance with your application, financial aid & literacy, and scholarships through the [Educational Opportunity Center](#) located on the UHMC campus. Call them at (808) 984-3286.

Step 2 – Get Ready To Enroll

COMPASS Placement Tests

You must take the English & Math COMPASS placement tests if you are a:

- Degree-seeking (Classified) student
- Non-degree seeking (Unclassified) student taking 8 or more credits
- Registering for a class with a COMPASS prerequisite.
- Early Admit student.

COMPASS testing is available at [The Learning Center](#) on a walk-in basis, or you can call (808) 984-3240 to find a testing center near you. You'll need your Student ID number and a picture ID. Calculators are permitted.

If you've taken the SAT or ACT test and received the minimum scores below, you may submit your official test results to Admissions for consideration instead of taking the COMPASS test.

- SAT-Verbal score of ≥ 510 —allow student to enroll in English 100
- ACT-Verbal score of ≥ 22 —allow student to enroll in English 100
- SAT-Math score of ≥ 510 —allow student to enroll in Math 103, 111 and 115
- ACT-Math score of ≥ 22 —allow student to enroll in Math 103, 111, and 115.

Transcripts

If you've attended college outside of the University of Hawai'i System, you'll also need to fill out a Transcript Evaluation Form and submit it with your official transcripts from your previous campuses and send to the Admissions Office. MyUH Account

Once you've received your acceptance letter with your Student ID number, go to myuh.hawaii.edu to set up your MyUH account. This UH portal will serve as your home base where you can:

- Register for classes.
- Add/drop classes.
- Check your registration status, which includes holds, academic standing, and prior credits completed.
- Find payment deadlines and make online credit card [payments](#).
- Check e-mail and your financial aid status.
- View [web registration tutorials](#).
- Access academic services.
- Find your final grade report and transcript.
