VETERAN EXEMPTION TO NON-RESIDENT TUITION RATE

Complete and submit this form to your campus admissions and records office prior to the first day of instruction of the term. Per University of Hawaii Board of Regents Policy RP 6.208 Board Exemptions to Non-Resident Tuition, the student may be exempted from the non-resident tuition rate if the student is a/an:

- (a) Veterans Post-9/11 GI Bill® (chapter 33) or Montgomery GI Bill® Active Duty (chapter 30) education benefits, who live in Hawai'i, and enroll at the University within three years of discharge from a period of active duty service of 90 days or more, OR
- (b) Individuals eligible to use transferred Post 9/11 GI Bill® educational benefits, who live in Hawai'i, and enroll at the university within three years of the transferor's discharge or release from a period of active duty service of 90 days or more, OR
- (c) Individuals eligible to use transferred Post 9/11 GI Bill® educational benefits, who live in Hawai'i, and whose transferor is a member of the uniformed service who is serving on active duty, OR
- (d) Individual using Post-9/11 GI Bill® (chapter 33) education benefits under the Marine Gunnery Sergeant John David Fry Scholarship, who live in Hawaii, OR
- (e) Individuals using educational assistance under the Veteran Readiness and Employment Services (formerly Vocational Rehabilitation and Employment (VR&E)) program and who live in Hawaii.

Veteran Readiness and Employment Recipients: I will continue to be exempt from paying non-resident tuition OR maintain veteran exemption status as long as I am eligible to use OR as long as I am receiving educational assistance under the Veteran Readiness and Employment Services (formerly Vocational Rehabilitation and Employment (VR&E)) program.

Post-9/11® Recipients: I will continue to be exempt from paying non-resident tuition OR maintain veteran exemption status as long as I remain continuously enrolled (other than regularly scheduled breaks between courses, semesters, or summer terms) at UH. If I have a break in attendance (stop-out), I understand that I must re-apply and re-qualify for the exemption within the three years of discharge. The re-enrollment date shall be the first day of instruction of the re-enrollment term.

Post 9/11 GI Bill® John D. Fry Veteran Recipients: I will continue to be exempt from paying non-resident tuition OR maintain veteran exemption status as long as I remain continuously enrolled (other than regularly scheduled breaks between courses, semesters, or summer terms) at UH. The re-enrollment date shall be the first day of instruction of the re-enrollment term.
