Lower Campus

1. The **Ho`okipa Building** is where our **Admissions and Records office** is located. Through the courtyard is where you can find the **Counseling Office**. Here you can meet with a counselor for academic advising. Further into this building is the **Educational Opportunity Center** which is where students can receive help with college forms, scholarships, and transferring. The **Financial Aid Office** staff can help you with filling out the FAFSA and the general Financial Aid process. If you are studying **Fashion Technology**, your classes will be held in the classrooms located at the end of this building.

2. **Automotive Technology** gives students the knowledge and experience to service and repair automobiles. Learn how to service engines, brakes, transmissions, and more.

3. **Sustainable Construction Technology** is a program that offers hands-on training in construction and lets students explore other options such as welding and architectural engineering.

4. **Auto Body and Repair & Painting** gives students skills in the repair of vehicle exteriors. Students will gain experience with auto body sheet metal and the application of body fillers and color coatings.

5. The **Veterans Resource Center** was established to support veterans, their spouses, and dependents. They also offer education consultation and information on Veterans Benefits.

6. Our **Health Center** provides free and low cost services for UHMC students. Health insurance is not required in order to receive their services.

7. **Kaiao Student Success Center** provides tutoring services for Math and English courses. They also manage **Mu`o A`e** which is a Native Hawaiian student support program.

8. The **Learning Center (TLC)** is where students take the COMPASS placement test. TLC also offers free tutoring for various courses, educational workshops, and a student computer lab.

9. If you are a Nursing student, you will be utilizing the **Nursing Labs** to gain experience in this field.

10. **Laulima** houses the University Center which enables students to take classes or even get a degree from another UH campus. Students and the community can also take non-credit courses through EdVenture and

Central Campus

1. The **Pa`ina Building** is where you can find our cafeteria. Meal plans are not offered however there is a food court instead. This is also where the Culinary program is housed.

2. **Ka`a`ike Building** is home to many general classrooms as well as skybridge and cable classes, which allow students to take course from outreach sites or from home. You can also find the IT Help Desk on the second floor.

3. **Pilina Building** is a Student Center. Here, you can find the **Bookstore** and purchase books and supplies needed for courses. You can also find the **Student Government office, Student Life office, Student Activities Council, Student Lounge, and UH Maui Fit.**

4. The **Library** allows student to borrow books, CD's, and DVD's. The third floor offers a quiet zone so students can study. Computers are also available for student use.

Upper Campus

1. The **Kupa`a Building** holds the Math Lab and a variety of Music classes.

2. The **Ho`oulu Building** is home to the **Agriculture Department**. Students can earn various certificates & degrees including agricultural science, nursery production, crop management, and more.

3. **Heona** is where you can find art classes such as painting, drawing, and ceramics.

4. **`Ike Le`a** is the newest addition to the campus. Here you can find general classrooms as well as dedicated science classrooms and labs.

5. The **Nursing Portables** hold classes and faculty offices for our Nursing programs.

6. **Noi`i** is one of the oldest buildings here on campus and was recently renovated. The first floor holds Dental Labs and the second floor holds general classrooms.

7. **Ka Lama Building** holds various types of classes. You can also find **Career Link** on the second floor for assistance with internships, resumes, and career guidance. The **Ka Lama Computer Lab** is also located on the second floor, you can also pick up your student ID here.

8. The **Hale Buildings** are where language classes are held. There are also other types of classes such as Dental Assisting and Hawaiian Studies.
